AN ORDINANCE MAKING APPOROPRIATIONS
FOR CORPORATE PURPOSES FOR
THE VILLAGE OF GERMANTOWN HILLS, ILLINOIS
FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING ON
THE 1ST DAY OF MAY, 2025
AND ENDING ON THE 30TH DAY OF APRIL, 2026

WHEREAS, the Village of Germantown Hills, Illinois, has complied fully with the notice and hearing requirements stated in 65 ILCS 5/8-2-9;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Germantown Hills, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION ONE. ORDINANCE	NO.
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AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE GERMANTOWN HILLS VILLAGE CODE, VILLAGE OF GERMANTOWN HILLS, ILLINOIS REGARDING OPEN BURNING REQUIREMENTS

WHEREAS the GERMANTOWN HILLS VILLAGE CODE ("Village Code") was duly adopted and published in the book form; and

WHEREAS Title 4, Chapter 4, Section 2 of the Village Code provides requirements for Open Burning; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees has determined that it is in the best interests of the Village and the health, safety and welfare of the Village and its citizens to amend Section 4-4-2 of the Village Code regarding open burning requirements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF GERMANTOWN HILLS, ILLINOIS.

The Village Code shall be amended by designating the current paragraph of Section 1 as Subsection A and adding the following to Section 1, designated as Subsection B.

B. As used in this chapter, the term "originated" means created, generated, or produced, and "originating from" means created, generated, or produced from the property of origin.

The Village Code shall be amended by adding the following to Section 2, Subsection C:

2. Open burning of landscape waste is permitted only on the property where such waste originated.

The Village Code shall be amended by adding the following to Section 2 by creating a new Subsection F:

F. It is unlawful to transport or cause to be transported any landscape waste from another property, whether within or outside the jurisdiction, for the purpose of open burning on a different premises. Burning of any landscape waste not originating from the property where the burning occurs is strictly prohibited.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage, approval and publication as may be required by law.

Plan revisions include the addition of erosion control blanket to help stabilize the ditch slopes and prevent foreseeable erosion. To address homeowner and Village concerns, erosion control blanket should be added to all ditch fore slopes to limit the potential for erosion. Add 980 square yards of Erosion Control Blanket at the agreed unit price. This results in a \$2,156.00 increase in contract price.
